FEEDING GUIDE

Ensure birds have access to clean, fresh water at all times.

Ensure Grains & Greens Complete and Balanced feed makes up the majority of the birds daily feed to ensure a balanced diet. Other feeds such as green scraps, pasture and hay may be fed, but only in small amounts.
