

FEEDING GUIDE

Ensure birds have continuous access to feed - do not restrict consumption.

Self feeders designed for poultry are a good way to ensure feed is continuously available.

Ensure birds have access to clean, fresh water at all times.

Ensure that Darling Downs Vegetarian Layer feed makes up the majority of the hens daily feed to ensure a balanced diet. Other feeds such as green scraps, pasture and hay may be fed, but only in small amounts.
